January 26, 1932 - December 18, 2019

On Wednesday morning, December 18, 2019, God called home a humble servant and true woman of God, Hazel Elizabeth Johnson Harkness. It is without a doubt, she heard the voice of the Lord say, "Well done my good and faithful servant daughter; well done. Now receive your rest and reward." She truly loved the Lord and is now rejoicing and celebrating with her loved ones who have gone on before.

Born January 26, 1931, in Antreville, South Carolina, she was the daughter of the late Myrtle Johnson and Ralph Newell. A member of Flat Rock AME Church, she attended and graduated from the public schools of Anderson County before earning a Bachelor of Science in Education from Allen University in Columbia, South Carolina, and pursuing post graduate work at the University of South Carolina. Hazel was a proud member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated.

Hazel was united in holy matrimony to her life parter, George S. Harkness, Sr., for sixty-one years. To this union, six children were born: George, Jr.; Timothy; Mark; Richard "Kip;" Jennifer "Dottie;" and Lori. A faithful and devoted wife and mother, Hazel (with invaluable assistance from George) raised four sons to become godly men and most of those life lessons were taught in strong home discipline, church involvement, respect, and compassion to give back to the community. Many of these lessons included priceless moments and memories. She raised two daughters and taught them to seek the best out of life through self-respect first and a faith-filled relationship with God. Hazel poured into many young women's lives, but she always ensured that her daughters knew her presence and support in all their life endeavors and journey. She had an especially close relationship with her baby girl, Lori, who was ever-present and always made sure "Mama" looked her best and celebrated all holidays from the assisted living facility to the nursing home. "Mama" will forever hold a special place in the hearts of all her children; in all her lessons to them, she was most consistent in sharing her love equally, they all felt like her favorite. She consistently shared her wisdom: "You plus God is a MAJORITY. Always TRUST GOD. He is FAITHFUL."

Soon after marrying, the young couple joined Chappelle Memorial AME Church, attending faithfully and ensuring their children were raised to know and love Jesus through Sunday School, church involvement and regular attendance. Perhaps it is that influence that impacted four of their children to go into the ministry and become ordained ministers, with three becoming pastors in the AME Church. While attending Chappelle Memorial, she served on the Stewardess Board, Missionary Society, Choir, and a Vacation Bible School Teacher. She was selected as Woman of the Year and received several other recognitions for her service at the church during her sixty plus years of membership.

How do you capture the life of such a uniquely dynamic and strong woman in the brevity of a program space? Hazel always encouraged education and compassion for underserved children and the elderly. She educated hundreds of children in her lifetime as a teacher and mentor. She began her teaching career in Abbeville, South Carolina, at Branch Street Elementary School; later, she relocated to Columbia and began working for Richland County School District One as a teacher. She retired from South Kilbourne Elementary School after over twenty-five years of dedicated and excellent service to educating the young minds of South Carolina. Following her retirement, she, along with her husband and other retiree friends and family, traveled the country and the world. They shared numerous trips and memories with friends, some of whom have also passed on to glory.

Hazel was deeply committed to her truest calling: mentoring young women and being a servant-leader in the community. She served as a leader in the Nation Council of Negro Women (Altrusettes), mentoring and guiding hundreds of girls over a twenty year span to be leaders and to give unselfishly to those underserved in the community. She served in leadership in the AME Church as a life-long member of the Missionary Society. She served year round visiting nursing homes, homes for children, the Ronald McDonald House, the March of Dimes, and numerous nonprofit organizations. She was an amazing spirit of love, dedication and integrity, and never sought or expected any type of recognition or reward. The spirit of servant-leadership is the legacy she left her children and grandchildren. Her special love was shown in support of her beloved sorority, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated. She served as an advisor for Allen University and Columbia College students for over twenty-five years. She set the bar for what is expected of all members of her beloved DST and shared it for over twenty-five years, resulting in outstanding women leaders of DST - both academically and servant-leaders. She and her husband never backed down from standing up for what is right, no matter how difficult, which garnered great levels of respect, from all races, in the church and the community.

When Hazel was not in the classroom, at a church meeting, or traveling with her husband,

you could find her hanging with her "sisters:" Lurena Cochran; Willena Bonner; Leola Garrett; cousin Anna Ruth; and cousin Hattie; all of whom have passed. They shared a blessed lifetime friendship and sisterhood. Other activities included visiting with her neighbors, working with the Susan B Ruff Garden Club - where she won many state fair awards for her flower arrangements, enjoying her bridge club, or shopping with Dottie and Lori at Tapp's Department Store. As the family grew with grandchildren, she spent many hours and visits supporting them at games, school programs, and grandparents' days. She loved her grandchildren and poured into them as much as she did her children, One thing she often shared with her grandchildren is that "you can't love something that cant's love you back," her effort to teach them the importance of not valuing material things but to value people.

In addition to her parents and husband, she was preceded in death by a sister, Dorothy Johnson (Adolph) Conner.
