Pleasant High School in Elliott, S.C. where she was captain of the girls’ varsity basketball team, a member of the marching band, and a school bus driver.

Upon graduating, Margie was employed with Campbell Soup Company, Incorporated for many years. After retiring, she devoted the rest of her life in service to her church, community, and family. She never liked sitting down and took on the role of providing helping hands in any way needed.

Her generous heart coupled with her willing spirit played a pivotal part in their growth and development. You could always count on her to lend a helping hand wherever she could even if it meant traveling out of town to assist with their care.
