



## Mary Williams Spann

September 28, 1940 - November 2, 2019

Mrs. Mary Josephine Williams-Spann, affectionately known as “Sweet Mary” and “Tiny” passed on Saturday, November 2, 2019 in Sumter, South Carolina. Born September 28, 1940 in Arlington, Georgia, she was the third oldest of six children of the late John C. Williams and Thelma H. Williams. During her youth, Mary’s parents relocated to Albany, Georgia. She attended primary and secondary school in the Albany Unified School District, and higher education was completed at Albany Technical College. Mary was employed as a Senior Manager at M&M Mars Incorporated later retiring after 15 years of dedicated service. She relocated to Charlotte, North Carolina in 1987, where she was employed in the healthcare industry. After some years, she met and married the late Eugene Spann of Sumter, South Carolina.

Mary was baptized as one of Jehovah’s Witnesses on May 19, 1984. Shortly after her baptism, she began her career as a regular pioneer, spending many hours each month talking to others about God’s Kingdom and the wonderful hope for all mankind in the near future. Many fond memories were shared by others who spoke of how, when in the ministry, she would stop her car in the road upon seeing a person so that she could talk to them about Jehovah.
