A Time to be Born: Mary Alice Harvin, daughter of the late Mrs. Vera Harvin Hampton and Mr. Nathaniel Hampton, Sr., was called to her eternal rest on Thursday evening, September 22, 2016 at Palmetto Health Tuomey Hospital in Sumter, South Carolina. She was born on December 10, 1927 in Sumter County.

A Time to Serve: At an early age in life, she accepted Jesus Christ as her personal Lord and Savior and joined Goodwill Presbyterian Church where she was very active. She served faithfully as a member of the Board of Deacons, Church School Secretary, Presbyterian Women, Sanctuary Choir, Faith Circle, Leadership and Administrative Division, Homecoming Captain, Church School teacher, and Vacation Bible School teacher. Because of her dedication and commitment, she received the Honorary Life Membership Award from the Presbyterian Women’s Organization. She also served as a member of the Coordinating Team for Presbyterian Women of the Presbytery of New Harmony. Mary Alice was a strong Christian woman of tremendous faith who loved the Lord and lived her life so it would be pleasing to her Savior. Her courage, compassion, kindness, and willingness to help those in need, and selflessness will always be remembered by her family and all those whom she helped. She lived by the motto: If I can help somebody as I pass along, If I can

cheer somebody with a word or song, If I can show somebody that they're traveling wrong, Then my living shall not be in vain.”

A Time to Grow and Learn: Mary Alice received her formal education from the Goodwill Parochial School of Sumter County, South Carolina. After graduating from high school, she matriculated at Morris College, Sumter, South Carolina where she received her Bachelor of Science degree in Elementary Education. She continued her education by receiving her Master of Education from North Carolina College, Durham, North Carolina. Her professional career reflected her commitment to the betterment of humanity through education. She served for 36 years as an elementary teacher in the public schools of South Carolina, helping her students to develop mentally, physically, and spiritually. Mary Alice was a dedicated and committed teacher who loved her students and who knew how to motivate them to get a good education. She knew that a good education was the key to success and tried to instill that in her students. Mary Alice was a Life Member of the National Education Association. She was also an active member of the Sumter County Education Association – Retired.

A Time to Die: Mary Alice lived a long and productive life. She loved working in her yard and even though she was sick, she continued to work in the yard. Several months ago she started losing her energy and strength in her legs. Two weeks ago she became ill enough to go to the hospital. When she left the hospital, she was placed under hospice care. She began her journey to the end of her life on Sunday evening, September 18, 2016. She was transported back to Palmetto Health Tuomey Hospital where she heard the Master's called on Thursday afternoon. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by a brother, William Harvin.
