



Rudolph Martin

October 30, 1932 - July 19, 2015

Rudolph Martin was born in Richland County in October 1932 to James and Clotell Geiger Martin. He was the oldest of seven children: Nathan (deceased), Betty Jean, Bobbie Ann, Johnny, Allen (deceased) and Albert, and he died at age 82.

Rudolph graduated from Booker T. Washington High School in 1953 and earned a B.A. degree in Physical Education in 1961. He served active duty in the United States Army from 1953 to 1955 in Ft. Eustis, Virginia, and after being honorably discharged, he served in the Army National Guard for 20 years, rising to the rank of Sergeant Major. He also served in the South Carolina State Guard where he was promoted to the rank of Chief Warrant Officer 2, then Captain of Vehicle Maintenance, retiring as a Lieutenant Colonel.

A committed educator, Rudolph taught auto mechanics in Edgefield and Union before joining the faculty in Richland School District One in 1967. He taught for 19 years and retired from Columbia High School in 1986. Rudolph served as a Deacon at Gill Creek Baptist Church and was a dedicated member of the Omicron Phi Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity and the Greenview Men's Club.

Rudolph was married to the late Lillian Holley for 49 years, and he is survived

by his children Vincient and Michelle, grandchildren Taneshia, Domonique and Amelia, and great-grandchildren DaMonté, DeAndré, Rheayanna, and Dai'jon.
