Mrs. Thomasina Christina Hunter Williams departed this earthly life for her heavenly reward on Wednesday, January 6, 2021, at Prisma Health Tuomey Regional Medical Center in Sumter, SC. Born in Sumter County on June 14, 1938, she was the second eldest daughter of the later Elsie Hunter Miller and Julius Miller, Sr.

Thomasina was educated in the public schools of Sumter County, (Willow Grove Elementary, Horatio, SC; High Hill, High School and later transferred to Ebenezer High School, Dalzell, SC, where she graduated in 1958.

During her youth and young adult life, Thomasina attended Willow Grove African Methodist Episcopal Church and High Hill African Methodist Episcopal Church faithfully with her mother and grandmother.
