Virginia Sewell Williams, 97, departed her earthly home on Monday, February 8, 2016 in Lexington, SC. She was the second oldest of fourteen children born in Lexington, SC to the late Joseph P. Sewell and Annie Bell Sligh Sewell on December 28, 1918. She was married to Hugh Holmes and from this union they had one daughter, Veora Holmes- Hutchins.

Virginia moved to New York City in 1940 where she lived with her oldest sister, Gladys Sewell Corley. She was naturally talented in the art of sewing and became an accomplished seamstress at Best Forms Foundation. She possessed the gift of sewing and enjoyed being able to do so for her family and friends. Virginia later married James Williams Jr. and resided in Queens, New York until they both retired and moved back to Lexington, SC to take care of her mother, the late Annie Bell Sewell.

Virginia was profound in her Christian faith; she loved the Lord and enjoyed serving him and attending Church. She was a loving and generous soul with a calm, sweet, and easy-going demeanor that made knowing her a joy. She lived her testament, and one of her favorite scriptures was, Mark: 12:30-31, which states, " And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength; this is the first commandment.
